

## Requirements and information for use of ArcExplorer:



Three use options exist:

### 1. Recommended option:

We recommend downloading the ArcExplorer application from our FTP site. It is free and you can choose among the three existent versions:

If you prefer, you can enter the ESRI page directly, from which you will also be able to download the program. Also, in their pages you will find more related information as well as the latest versions of the software.

#### Instructions for use:

Once the program is installed, open it and select the route WWW. A window will appear that requests a name to identify the map service. We have written GIS CIAT. Click on "Add URL" and insert this address:  
<http://gisweb.ciat.cgiar.org/scripts/esrimap.dll>. Click OK

### 2. For Users of Microsoft Internet Explorer: (two options)

a) [Cliente ActiveX](#) of ArcExplorer only works with Microsoft Internet Explorer in the 4.2 version or above. If you have these requirements, but the application does not open, you should modify the security level of the browser to half level or under. That is, you should go to " Tools ", open "Internet options", and in the file " Security " check that it indicates "medium" or "low." Now, try again!

b) The HTML Client of ArcExplorer can be viewed both on Internet Explorer and Netscape Communicator, and it has the same functionalities as ActiveX Client. There are two versions from which to choose:

### 3. For Users of Netscape Communicator: (two options)

a) [Cliente ActiveX](#) of ArcExplorer: to open the application with Netscape Communicator, you need to install the plugin for ActiveX and VBScript that you can find on the official Netscape Web page.

b) The HTML Client of ArcExplorer can be viewed both with Internet Explorer and with Netscape Communicator, and it has the same functionalities as the ActiveX Client. There are two versions from which to choose:
